They passed all the same tests as their male counterparts — but they were rejected by NASA because they were women. The story follows the efforts of Jerrie Cobb, the first American woman to pass all three phases of NASA's testing. Though she and her colleagues persevered in their quest to become astronauts, they met hostility, ridicule and challenge at every corner. It would take 20 years before NASA would select its first female astronaut candidate.
