AP Testing Registration Instructions

Potomac Falls High School 2023-2024

Please follow the three steps below to register for your AP test(s).

VERY IMPORTANT

There are two fees that went into effect on **November 16, 2023**:

- * There is a **\$40 Late fee** for each new test you order through March 15, 2024. No new AP tests can be ordered for any reason after March 15, 2024.
- * There is a \$40 Unused Test fee for each test you order and do not take in May.

Step #1

Register for each AP course you plan to take in your College Board account at myap.collegeboard.org



You must follow the "Joining Your AP Class Section" instructions on the next page to sign-up for your AP course(s). Your AP teacher will provide you with the Join Code.

Not enrolled in the AP course at Potomac Falls HS? This includes Academy, Virtual and homeschool students. You must register for the "Exam Only" section. You will need to obtain the **Join Code** for your AP test by emailing Mr. Vogl, Testing Coordinator, at Matthew.Vogl@lcps.org.

Step #2

Email Mr. Vogl at Matthew.Vogl@lcps.org asking him to change your testing decision to "Yes" in your College Board account



You are not able to do this yourself. The testing decision must be marked "Yes" in your College Board account to have a test ordered for you.

Step #3

Pay for your AP test(s) by credit card

LCPS pays for your <u>first four (4) AP tests</u>: The count to four is *cumulative* across school years for tests you take in LCPS high schools. In other words, LCPS is paying for a total of four (4) AP tests for you during your entire time in LCPS. You must submit payment for tests beyond the four (4) covered by LCPS.



Each AP test is \$89 (with the exception of AP Seminar and Research at \$137 each). You will also owe a **\$40 Late fee** for each new test you order.

HOW TO SUBMIT PAYMENT: Please log into SchoolCash Online (<u>lcps.schoolcashonline.com</u>) to pay any AP fees you owe. If you do not have an account, please click on the "**Register**" button on the login page to create one. All test fees must be paid by March 15, 2024. After that time, LCPS may cancel your AP test(s).

Joining Your AP Class Section

Do you already have an account? All College Board programs are connected through one account, so if you created one for AP, PSAT/NMSQT, SAT, or BigFuture Opportunity Scholarships, you're all set. You just need your username and password to sign in.

Don't remember your username or password? Follow the "Need help signing in?" links at myap.collegeboard.org.

Don't have a College Board account? Please sign-up at collegeboard.org/register. A family member should <u>not</u> create an account for you. Keep your account information in a safe place only you can access.

How can I access AP Classroom resources? After you enroll in a course, click on "Go to AP Classroom" to access resources for your course or "Assignments" to see any assignments from your teacher. You can also watch AP Daily videos for the course.



1 SIGN IN

Sign in to myap.collegeboard.org with your College Board account. This is the same login you use to access your AP scores, PSAT/NMSQT® scores, or register for the SAT®. If you don't have a student account, click the Create Account link.



2 JOIN A COURSE

Click the Join a Course or Exam button. Before you do this, make sure you have the sixcharacter join code from your teacher. You'll need it to join a class section.



SUBMIT YOUR JOIN CODE

Enter the join code your teacher gave you. Click **Submit**.



VERIFY COURSE INFORMATION

Make sure the information that comes up is for the course you're taking. If it is, click **Yes**.



6 FILL OUT REGISTRATION INFORMATION

The first time you enroll in an AP course in My AP, you'll provide registration information. It's important to be accurate. You only have to do this once. Check your information that's already shown and provide the remaining information. If your name, middle initial, or date of birth needs correcting, contact AP Services for Students after completing your registration. If you make changes to any other information in your AP Profile, you'll also need to sign into your College Board account to make the same changes.



6 CONGRATULATIONS!

You're enrolled in your AP course. If you're taking multiple AP courses, repeat steps 2-4 for each course you're taking this year, using the unique join code for each course.
